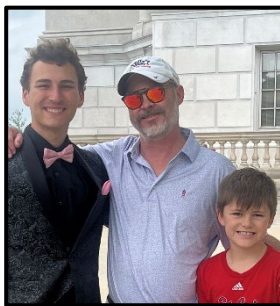


## District I

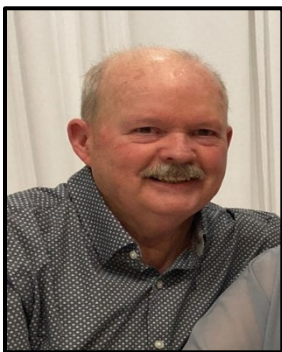


## **Nancy Masterson**
