#### **2024 STATE 4-H CONGRESS OBJECTIVES**

The purpose of Missouri 4-H State Congress is to serve as the annual state gathering for Missouri 4-H'ers ages 14-18 so that they may engage in educational programming related to leadership, communication, college and career pathways, and agriculture and natural resources; network with 4-H youth, extensionists, and volunteers from across the state; participate service-learning activities grounded in experiential learning and positive youth development principles; and democratically elect the members of the Missouri 4-H State Council.

The learning domains for Missouri 4-H State Congress are

- 1. Leadership,
- 2. Agriculture and Natural Resources,
- 3. College and Career Preparation.

After participating in Missouri State 4-H Congress leadership programming, in one or more of the following, 4-H'ers will be able to

- a) Articulate the Five Stages of Group Development,
- b) Outline their key personality characteristics and behaviors in the context of the self and teams,
- c) Characterize the seven behaviors of servant leaders,
- d) Ascertain the process for systems-based thinking as change agents.

After participating in Missouri State 4-H Congress agriculture and natural resource programming, in one or more of the following, 4-H'ers will be able to

- a) Explain the major commodities groups vital to Missouri agricultural production,
- b) Outline the student-run retail experiences offered by CAFNR including the Tiger Gardens Floral Shop, Mizzou Meat Market, and Bucks Ice Cream Shop.
- c) Identify the most immediate challenges facing the agricultural and natural resource sector of Missouri.

After participating in Missouri State 4-H Congress college and career programming, in one or more of the following, 4-H'ers will be able to

- a) Distinguish the difference between intrinsic and extrinsic factors for career motivation,
- b) Articulate possible career paths for their skillsets or prospective areas of study,
- c) Identify the programmatic offerings at the University of Missouri that interest them,
- d) Generalize elements of the college experience common to students at four-year institutions of higher learning.

#### **Dress Code**

#### The dress code for State 4-H Congress is casual.

- Shorts, skirts, jeans, or dress pants; t-shirts, blouses, polo, or dress shirts. Athletic shoes, flip-flops, croc-type footwear are allowed.
- Nametags are to be worn at all times around the neck.

#### The following items are not appropriate at Missouri State 4-H Congress:

- Shorts, skirts, and dresses must be appropriate length
- Tube tops; clothing that exposes the midriff, navel, back or cleavage; halter tops; seethrough clothing; cut-offs, ripped jeans or other clothing with holes; one-shoulder or strapless tops; muscle shirts; bare feet are not appropriate at any activity;
- Clothing that advertises alcoholic beverages, tobacco products or drugs; dress and appearance should not present health or safety hazards or cause disruption;
- Casual tops with spaghetti straps or Shirts with straps less than 1'' wide;
- Clothing that has vulgar, obscene or offensive messages or images;
- Camisoles, Pajamas/sleepwear or outfits with visible undergarments are not to be worn outside your room.

#### **Fragrance-free Environment:**

It is our goal to ensure that we have an environment that is conducive to learning and working. Individuals are often times sensitive to products that we wear every day and may cause severe medical difficulties to those who are sensitive to them. Products that may cause symptoms include: perfumes, after shave lotions, hair spray, colognes and body sprays. We thank you for your flexibility and your good faith efforts to meet this accommodation.

#### **Enforcement:**

Missouri State 4-H staff, Extension personnel, adult volunteer leaders, and members of the Missouri State 4-H Council may ask any individual to modify their clothing selection if the Missouri State 4-H Congress dress code is not met. If a delegate is asked to modify clothing and feels their clothing does not violate the dress code, they may request to speak with the State 4-H Congress Coordinator, who will make a final decision.

#### **REGISTRATION:**

State 4-H Congress welcomes rising high school freshman to outgoing high school seniors or youth 4-H ages 14-18. The cost of this year's conference is \$150.00 includes housing, meals, Congress activities, and t-shirt.

Registration through 4HOnline\* (https://mo.4honline.com) will open on **March 1**, **2024** and extend through **April 15**, **2024**. *We cannot accept registrations after April 15*.

There will be no key deposit on residence hall keys; however, those not turning in their keys upon checkout will be charged \$15.00 for the replacement key. Also, any damage to the room will be billed to the individuals concerned. There will be a \$5.00 charge to replace any lost meal cards.
